**Course Description:** GEO 110C is an introduction to the various geosciences disciplines and corresponding JSG degree programs and research areas and provides basic career building skills for the early student. Emphasis is placed building familiarity with Jackson School resources and support, as well as the skills needed for success in in the undergraduate process, graduate school admission, and personal career strategies.

**Course Goals/Objectives:** The overarching goal of this course is to assist Jackson School students in taking control of their academic journey within the Jackson School and their career management beyond it. After completing this course, students will be:

- Confidently select their major during their sophomore year, based on an increased familiarity with Jackson School of Geosciences degree options and upper division course work.
- Conduct their academic affairs, including registration and academic planning, with an increased sense of confidence and personal responsibility.
- Demonstrate improved career planning skills, including job searching, interview, networking communication skills, and career-focused writing and research.

**Grading:** Progress towards these goals will be assessed through a series of in-class workshop activities, as well as a limited number of take-home assignments. No final grade for the course is assigned to student.

**Course Prerequisites:** There are no prerequisites for this course. This course is restricted to geosciences majors, but may not be counted toward a degree in geological or environmental sciences.
