There will be material in this class that will be difficult to watch and listen to involving criminal acts of a sometimes violent and sexually violent nature. If these types of images or discussions offend your sensibilities or trigger difficult experiences for you, this is probably not the course for you. I do my best to present this material in the most respectful and professional way possible, however, if at any time you become emotionally overwhelmed by the class material, please see me and I will be happy to refer you to someone at the counseling center that can help you cope with what you are experiencing.

Course Goals

Expose students from multiple disciplines to the various psychological roles and influences in the courtroom. It is hoped that the multidisciplinary makeup of the class will contribute to this as students from a variety of programs are welcome to enroll. The course has both undergraduates and graduate students.

Become familiar with case law as it relates to expert testimony, particularly as expert testimony applies to mental health professionals.

Become familiar with ethical practices of forensic psychology.

A survey of mental health professional roles in the forensic context from civil to criminal issues.

This course carries the Ethics and Leadership flag for Undergraduate sections. Ethics and Leadership courses are designed to equip you with skills that are necessary for making ethical decisions in your adult and professional life. You should therefore expect a substantial portion of your grade to come from assignments involving ethical issues and the process of applying ethical reasoning to real-life situations.

Students with Disabilities

A good number of lectures and assignments will be available on canvas. I will not regularly take attendance and I consider you to be adults that can make your own choices about the investment you want to make in your classes and education. Each week, I will give you notice through canvas about whether or not we will have class online or in the classroom for the following week. Some in class activities will have points associated with them, so missing class will cause you to miss points for the class. We will do our best to record these classes so that if you have an authorized, documented excuse, you will be able to view the class through canvas and participate using an alternative assignment for those points. Authorized excuses include doctors notes or notes from your advisor. Choosing to miss class to do other things that seem more interesting or fun in the moment, do not count as authorized excuses.
