Adolescence is one of the most enigmatic and difficult life span transitions. As youth seek to redefine themselves, values and support systems are adjusted to fit the assumptions of the new identity, which may or may not include academic achievement. This Master's Report conducts a literature review to better understand the research exploring the ways in which parents, students, and counselors impact adolescent academic achievement. The findings in this report suggest that a community approach to learning is the most effective tool for students; parents and school counselors are offered interventions when it appears that a value for learning and achievement is lost in the redefinition of the adolescent self.
