Sept 22	Get packets of information to your recommendation letter writers (e.g., CV, what you are interested in, talking points)		
Oct 5	Faculty members should have recommendation letters completed		
Oct 15	Successful completion of your dissertation proposal meeting by this date. <b>Register for the match after</b> completion.		
Oct 17	Submit portion of APPI that I need to approve (Summary of Doctoral Training, including hours, program info) before this date, along with updated strengths/weaknesses		
Nov 1	Likely earliest internship application deadline		
December	Internship interviews start. Most are in January		
Feb 7	Submit rank order for the Match (Phase I). It would be smart to do this early (computers crash!)		
Feb 23	APPIC Match Day, Phase I (official results of the Match released)		
March 1	Application submission deadline, phase II		
March 19	Submit rank order for the Match, phase II		
March 26	APPIC Phase II Match day		
End of second	Last day to defend dissertation in order to get reduced
